Campout Rules

The following is a list of rules each Scout in Troop 53 is expected to follow on any type of outing. If you do not follow these rules you will be dealt with by the Junior Leaders, Scout Master, or other adults including the Troop committee.

1. No running. You could fall and hurt yourself.
2. One knife (jack, lock). You will only need one.
3. No matches. The troop will provide enough.
4. No playing with the matches.
5. Fire stays in the pit. It is very easy to start forest fires or burn yourself or others.
6. Keep food out of tents. There is nothing animals like more; but they don't know how to use zippers so they make our tents Swiss cheese.
7. No speakers to be used in the tents. We come to nature to enjoy it, not "civilize" it.
8. Carry out requests before they become orders. We expect you to do everything you are asked to do with a smile. Doing something that needs doing without being asked is a mark of an excellent Scout.
9. Stay in camp. It is rude to wander through others' camping sites.
10. Clean equipment properly. Clean it better than the way you found it.
11. Bring Scout books. Remember a Scout is prepared.
12. Leave with what you brought. Take everything you came with, including garbage.
13. No rude, sarcastic remarks. They are cruel and not necessary.
14. No horsing around. Remember we are guests and it may be a long way to the hospital.
15. Pay attention when being spoken to. It is polite to listen attentively when someone is speaking, they may be trying to warn you of something.
